Rhiannon is the fastest female para athlete in Australia and she proudly holds the Australian and Oceania records in the T38 100m, 200m, and 400m. She is passionate about advocating for equal opportunities and rights for para athletes, with the goal of ensuring that their achievements are not merely acknowledged but celebrated.

She strives to transform the narrative surrounding para sports and pave the way for future generations. She aspires to be the para athlete she wished she had to look up to when she was younger.

Rhiannon's athletics journey began in 2014 at a para-come-try day, igniting a passion that has propelled her to extraordinary heights within the sport. As a two-time Commonwealth Games medallist and three-time World Championships medallist, she has consistently showcased her skills and determination on the international stage.

Notably, at the age of 15, she made history by becoming the youngest para athlete from any country to win a medal at the 2018 Commonwealth Games on the Gold Coast, securing a silver medal in the T38 100m. Then in 2019, she shattered barriers as the first Australian female with cerebral palsy to achieve a sub-13-second 100m.

In addition to her athletic achievements, she has been recognised for her leadership and contributions to society. As a finalist in the Western Australian of the Year in the Youth Category and a recipient of the Australian Olympic Change-Maker Award, she is committed to making a positive impact in her community.

Balancing her athletic pursuits with academic excellence, she is currently pursuing a Bachelor of Biological Science (majoring in Wildlife Conservation) at the University of Western Australia. Through her studies, she aims to contribute to the conservation field while continuing to excel in the world of athletics.
